RULES

- 1. The officials shall consist of President, Vice presidents, Chairman, Secretaries, Treasurer and Committee, all of whom shall be elected annually.
- 2. The Show shall be open to all.
- 3. Entry Fee: 20p for each exhibit. Children 20p to cover any number of exhibits. Any person entering 15 or more classes will receive a free entry to the show to be claimed from the Secretary on Show Day.
- 4. Competitors must attach a standard envelope provided by the Show Committee when staging exhibits to each exhibit, showing the class number on the outside, with the name of the exhibitor on a slip of paper inside.
- 5. The Marquee will be open on Sunday morning at 8am for staging up to 11am. The public will be admitted to the marquee, once judging has been completed at approximately 2pm.
- 6. Competitors must give notice to the Entries Secretary of the articles they intend to exhibit by Friday 1st September 2023. Entries to be accompanied by Entry Fee. One entry allowed in any one class except in Walking Stick Classes where two entries per person are allowed and Class 96 - A Hat for a Child for charity multiple entries accepted.
- 7. The Committee have the power to elect judges whose decision shall in all cases be final and any objection to any award must be handed to the Secretary, in writing, before 3pm.
- 8. The Committee shall use every precaution to prevent damage to exhibitors articles but they will not be responsible for any damage or loss. Articles may not be removed before the prize giving has ended (approx. 4.30pm). Any exhibits not removed by 4.45pm will be treated as a donation in aid of the show.
- 9. All cups to be returned to Secretary of the Show at least two weeks before the next Show.
- 10. If any exhibit is not up to standard the judges may decline to award a prize.
- 11. Age to be on the front of all Children's Entries (up to the age of 15 years old).
- 12. All Horticultural Exhibits (except for classes 59 to 63) to be grown by Exhibitor.
- 13. All Exhibits to be entirely the work of the exhibitor. Any exhibit that has previously won a first prize (except in walking stick classes) will not be eligible for further competition.

4oz. Butter or Margarine, 1/4 Pint of Water

8oz. Self Raising Flour,

1 Medium Egg

Method

Heat oven to 150 deg. C Grease 7" cake tin. Place fruit, sugar, margarine and water in a pan, simmer slowly with lid on for 20 mins. Allow to cool, then add beaten egg and stir in the flour. Pour into prepared tin and bake for about one and a half hours.





The History of "Etal Horticultural Show"

One of the oldest one-day village shows in the county Etal Show is thriving and attracted over 1,000 visitors in 2022.

Now in its 85th year, the history of competitive gatherings of one sort or another at Etal dates back a great deal further. The archives of the society contain a newspaper article from 1887 which gives a detailed account of the 48th summer show of the "Etal (sic) Horticultural Society" which took place in the "large and commodious school-room at Etal". There were flower and vegetable classes, including such quaint descriptions as "Large Nosegay of cut flowers", "Double Brompton Stocks", "Early Horn Carrots" and "Gooseberries

(by weight)" and "Gooseberries (by flavour)". There was also a class for the local children to enter a bouquet of wild flowers, for which a total of 31 prizes were awarded! Not content just with the horticultural competition during the afternoon, the locals of that time apparently continued their revels into the evening and "dancing was kept up with great spirit until about 10 o'clock, when all returned to their respective homes highly delighted"!

Another newspaper article from the archives describes an even earlier jamboree known as the "Etal Gymnastic Games", a kind of local Olympics which apparently was an annual event in the early 1800s. It comprised competitions in wrestling, running, jumping, hammer throwing and such like, and in 1844 was presided over by Lord Frederick FitzClarence of Etal Manor. It was a grand affair with "a beautiful pavilion, 56 feet in length and 36 in breadth, which was brought specially from London for purpose".



Tips for Novices Exhibitors

It can be daunting trying to work out where to start with an entry for the show, but if you remember to stick to what the schedule asks, you're well on your way. We've included some example classes from different categories to help you find the confidence to fill in the entry form!

Fruit and Vegetables

Try to pick the fruit and vegetables that look similar in shape and size. Uniformity is more appealing than three completely different shaped large carrots.

Carrots (classes 10 & 11)

Place your longest of the three carrots in the middle, tie the stems with green string and cut them so they are equal in length, making them more uniformed.

Shallots (classes 5, 6 & 7)

Put Shallots on a plate of dry sand or sawdust, resting on some rings (make these by cutting toilet rolls tube). Tip your Shallots back slightly, making them look a big longer.

Tomatoes (19 & 20)

Tomatoes can be presented on a paper doily and garnished with some parsley.

Flowers

Wet Oasis is great for positioning flowers, but crumpled newspaper works too.

Make sure your flowers are uniform and there aren't any big differences in size.

You can cut the flowers up to two days before the show and stand them in deep water.

If you think your rose is ready, but it's a while before the show, cut it and put it in the fridge until show day.

Preserves

Make sure your jam, lemon curd and chutney jars are always filled to the top and labelled with the date and type clearly.

Jams and lemon curd should be sealed with a wax disc and cellophane. The judge will check for a pop when they open it!

Chutney tastes better over time, so don't be afraid to make it in advance.

Tips for Novice Exhibitors cont'd.

Photography

Don't be afraid to experiment with different angles and subjects.

Fill the frame with a clear focus of the image.

Different times of the day can give you different lighting, so try from morning to night to capture your image.

Carry your camera with you as much as you can, you never know where you'll find your inspiration!

Needlework

Make sure the back of your pattern is just as neat as the front.

Try to use your own designs.

Make sure A Hat for a Child (class 96) and Soft Toys (class 102) would be safe for children, so avoid loose buttons and choking hazards.
